



Finance Highlights







Annual Debt

Lakewood School Progress Report December 2016

Key Accomplishments:

Pillar of Curriculum and Instruction:

- 4K-8th grade all have one launch unit building in reading to begin the 2017-2018 school year.
- Before beginning to unpack math standards all staff involved with math or science standards took a step back to really make sense of the 8 Standards for Mathematical Practices. Testing involves a lot more than math computation, and these practices are the foundation for building problem solving skills and critical thinking as mathematicians.
- Maintaining the use of the workshop model as our instructional framework is taking place through observations and follow up meetings.
- Observing the activities that students are doing in classroom to ensure they are tied to teacher set learning targets.
- Dates will be set for continued work for the second half of the year with Mary Jo and Peggy Black by the first week of January.
- Reading pilot has begun and will run through the end of February utilizing a program called Reading Plus. There are three aspects to this program that relate to fluency, comprehension and vocabulary.
- Public Practice and Classroom Walkthroughs: We are in second phase of implementation all staff encouraged to participate. This will be come and expectation for all in January and will transition into a norm by the end of this year.

Pillar of Climate/Culture:

- Documented behaviors at about this time last year totaled about 313, this year they are at about 165.
- Majority of students have books at all times!




Pillar of Finance and Resource Allocation:










